Betty Carlin (1922-2013). Longtime archivist of this Society, passed away on February 1st.

It is with deep regret that we learned of the passing of Betty Carlin. Betty was a highly active member in the Society for over 30 years, contributing one suspects 10,000 or more hours of volunteer work, and serving as the Society's founding archivist. For many of those who knew her, Betty was the Historical Society, and her dedication to her tasks attracted a number of contributions that might otherwise have gone elsewhere. Among these contributions were the William Wiegand pa-

volunteers Edda Whaley, Becky Orfila, Alicia Ellis and Cynthia Hammond for helping serve lunch that day.

pers donated by Wiegand's children Jane Randolph and her brother Bill.

According to Betty, her deep commitment in our local history began in the mid 1970s when a friend encouraged her to begin recording oral histories. And it is to Betty and her recordings that we know so much about daily life in the Pass in the early 20th century. In addition to archivist, Betty served as volunteer office manager, and, with her late husband Bill, a docent at the building. (Bill also did a significant amount of work.)

Betty was for many years was also responsible for preparing the annual tour of homes brochure, and she authored "A Brief History of Pass Christian."

And it was Betty who organized so many of numerous day trips to area museums and exhibits. (Including a trip to the D-Day Museum, to which Betty later donated her World War II WAVE uniform.)

At the time of her retirement in 2003, a grateful Society voted Betty an honorary lifetime membership and she was also made an emeritus trustee. ■
